


# How can I manage my Hybrid Class - Scenario 1



**Context:**  
students will have classes two days a week in person and two days a week online. face-to-face classes will be broadcast online at the same time. One day a week, students with lower performance will go to school and the rest will work online

This will not be as complicated as you may think, we just have to modify our teaching style a bit and take advantage of methods such as Project Based Learning (PBL). This way students maintain an active participation during their classes.

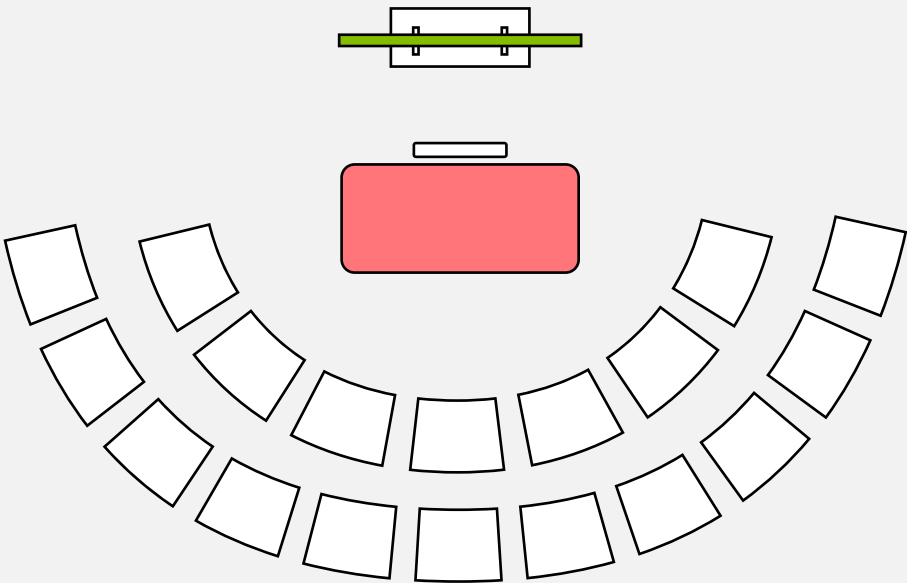
## TIPS:

- You will have to divide your group into two “mini groups”. Try to maintain equity between both groups..
- Lean on a platform for tasks, jobs, activities, etc. ASSUME that if the internet connection fails, your online group must continue working, for example, with Google classroom, this will allow you to have your backup activities ready for any situation
- In order to not generate double work for you, tray that all the evidence, work and tasks are delivered digitally. Even if your students attend class, have your students take a small photo and upload it to your platform.
- The fifth day will be to call to class those who require more support and face-to-face follow-up. Allow those who stay at home wotk with a game or playful activity.

In green you can see the days online, white in person and yellow the low performance dat. Do not be afraid to move the day last day to Wednesday for example, it could help you to continue with the next topic having Thursday and Friday for class right next to it.

To set up your classroom, I suggest a half moon. This way you can put your laptop in front of the room for those students who are connected, you would stay in front for the transmission, and it will be easier for you to monitor your face-to-face class since they are in your range of view.

Therefore, you will not repeat content, you will repeat your last class.</li><li>Repeat this process throughout your week, so you have two online moments and two face-to-face moments.</li></ul>
