SMART (Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, Time bound)

Lifelong Learning Strategies.

Start small and train your students to choose the strategies than can be applied in different situations, tasks and subjects.

Metacognitive Strategies

Help learners plan for learning, determine how they are doing, identify and solve problems and assess how well they have achieved their goal.

- Set goals
- Monitor progress
- Assess: Self questioning
- Manage your learning:**
Identify how you learn best, seek
- opportunities to practice

Task-based strategies

Help the learners to focus on a specific task by identifying how to use background knowledge, their senses, different resources, and their organizational skills.

- Make connections, use background knowledge
- Make inferences
- Predict
- Personalize.
- Transfer
- Summarize, paraphrase, classify
